- * Synonyms: motivation, aggravation

- * Definition: able to express ideas clearly and effectively
- * Other form: to articulate (v.)
- * Synonyms: eloquent, well-spoken



vehemently (adv.)

- * Definition: done w/ strong, often angry, feelings
- * Other form: vehement (adj.)
- * Synonyms: forcefully, angrily

simultaneous (adj.)

- * Definition: happening at the same time
- * Other form: simultaneously (adv.)
- * Synonym: at the same time



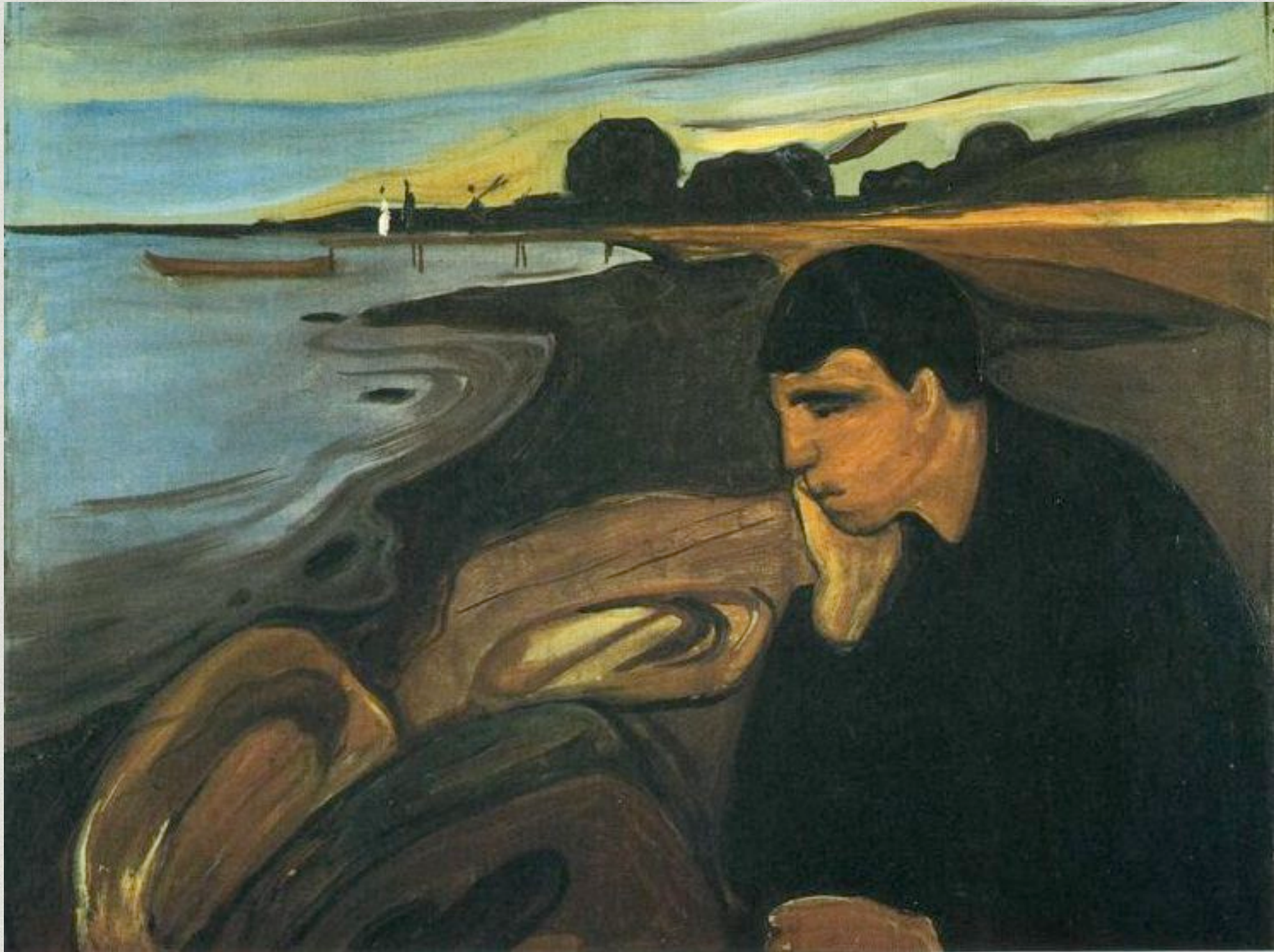

melancholy (n.)

- * Definition: a persistent sad mood or feeling
- * Other form: melancholic (adj.)
- * Synonyms: depression, gloom

- * Definition: having the right to something (usually followed by “*to*”)
- * Other form: entitlement (n.)
- * Synonyms: allowed, authorized

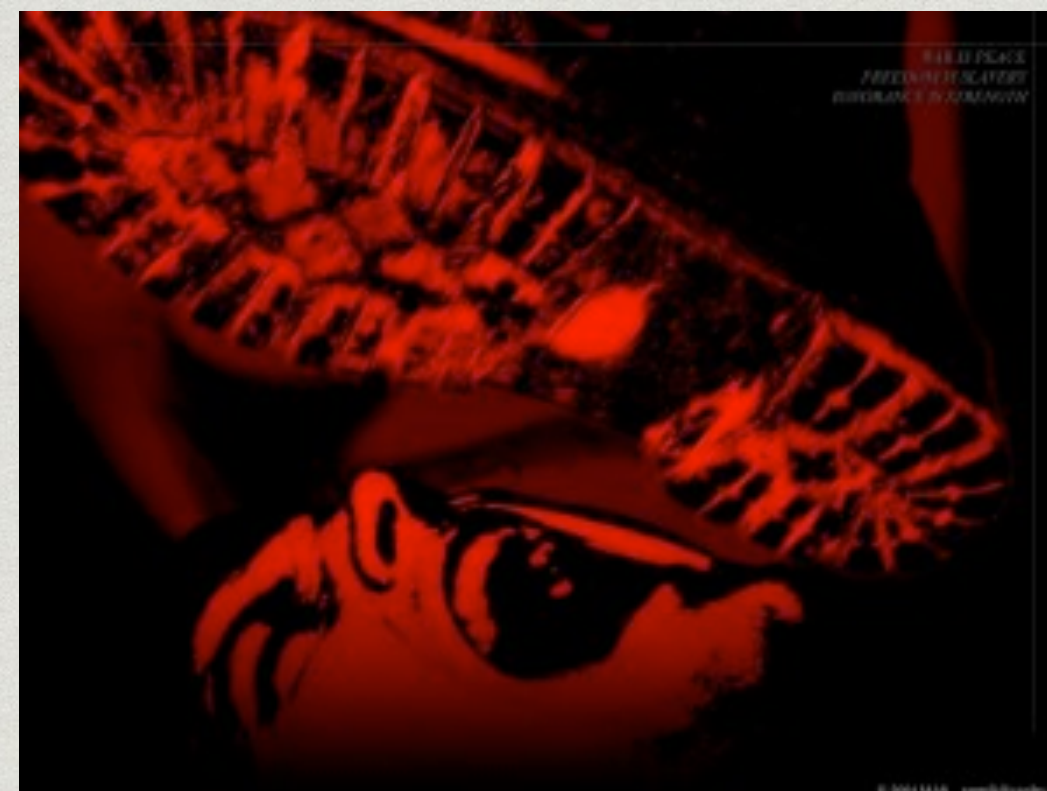

- * Definition: very cruel or unpleasant
- * Other forms: oppression (n.), oppressively (adv.)
- * Synonyms: harsh, tyrannical
